It will be a great time for old and new Linwoodians to get together for fun, games, food and exchanging memories and make new ones.

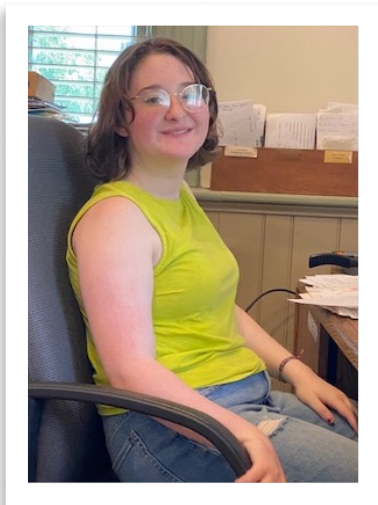
